



TIMUQUANA COUNTRY CLUB

CUSTOMS & TRADITIONS

These customs and traditions are established to promote the enjoyment of the Club. In addition to the specific rules and policies set forth below, members, their families, and guests are expected to act politely and with decorum. We hope you have an enjoyable visit at Timuquana Country Club.

General Policies

- Smoking and vaping are not permitted in any interior space at the Club. Members and guests may smoke outside, excluding the pool deck and areas designated for meal service.
- The Club does not permit business papers to be visible in the dining rooms or common areas, with the exception of Club business.
- Children nine (9) years of age and younger must be in the care and control of a parent or guardian at all times.
- Club staff is charged with the enforcement of Club policies by the Board of Governors. Members and their guests will be reminded of the rules by the staff should any violations occur.

Electronic Devices

The use of cell phones and similar devices should be conducted in a way that is respectful to others. All electronic devices must be placed on silent while on Club property. Silent communications, such as text messaging and emailing, are permitted. Voice communications are not permitted in the Clubhouse with the exception of private function rooms. Laptops and tablets are not permitted in the River Room.

Dress Code

Clothing should be respectful of the Club's traditions and standards, as well as suitable for the event. Minimum standards are as follows:

Dining Rooms

Pow Wow Room

- No swimwear, bare feet, or bare midriffs.
- Tasteful denim that is absent of rips or holes is permitted.
- Cover-ups, sports attire, and t-shirts are permitted until 5:30 pm.
- Collared shirts and ladies' equivalent dress are required for members and guests after 5:30 pm, with the exception of children twelve (12) years of age and younger.

River Room

- No denim, swimwear, cover-ups, sports attire, bare feet, or midriffs are permitted in the River Room at any time.
- Jackets for men are recommended.

River Terrace

- The River Terrace follows the Pow Wow Room dress code.

Golf

- Men must wear slacks or full-length walking shorts and a collared shirt.
- Ladies must wear a sports blouse or shirt and slacks, walking shorts, or a skirt.
- Hats must always be in the bill-forward position.

Pool

- All children who are not potty-trained must wear the I Play swim diapers, available for purchase at the Lifeguard Kiosk. Diaper changing must be done in the restrooms.
- Members and guests must wear appropriate swimwear that is modest and not too revealing. For gentlemen, basketball or tennis shorts are prohibited.
- Bathers may not change into or out of swim attire on the pool deck. The pool restrooms should be used for this purpose.
- Upon exiting the pool, all members and guests must be covered or clothed as you venture to other destinations of the Club.

Fitness

- Appropriate workout attire that reflects the Club's traditions is required.
- Shirts are required at all times. For ladies, workout bras alone do not qualify as shirts.
- Workout shorts must be long enough to cover the buttocks at all times, including when bending, stretching, running, etc.
- Athletic shoes are required. Bare feet and open-toe or open-back shoes are not permitted.
- Jeans, jean shorts, or bathing suits are not permitted.

Clubhouse

- Gentlemen must remove hats while inside the Clubhouse, with the exception of the Fitness Center.

Policies

Locker Room

Children seventeen (17) years of age and younger are not permitted in the Clubhouse Locker Rooms.

Pool

- Children nine (9) years of age and younger must be in the care and control of a parent or guardian while in the pool.
- Children ten (10) to twelve (12) years of age must be accompanied by a parent or guardian at all times.

Dining Rooms

- Food and beverages consumed on Club property must be obtained through Timuquana Country Club. No outside food and beverage is permitted, with an exception granted for cakes.

Pow Wow Room

- Children twelve (12) years of age and younger are not permitted in the Pow Wow Lounge after 5:30 pm.

River Room & River Terrace

- Children twelve (12) years of age and younger are not permitted in the River Room or on the River Terrace during normal hours of operation. When the River Room is not in use, children twelve (12) years of age and younger are permitted.
- Youth twenty (20) years of age and younger must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Pets

- Dogs and other pets, with the exception of service or emotional support animals, are not permitted in the Clubhouse, Pool, Terrace, The Grove, or River Lawn at any time other than for scheduled events that would permit them. There is no restriction for walking dogs in the parking lots, along Timuquana Road, or on the golf course cart paths when the course is closed.

Parking

- Dedicated golf cart parking is available at the south end of the Club's parking lot or where space is available at the Cart Barn. Golf carts should not park in standard car parking spaces, on the pavers, or around the curbs at the pool entrance.
- Parking is restricted along Timuquana Road at all times.
- Parking lots at Timuquana Country Club are designated for members, their guests, and Club staff only. Arrangements must be made with the front office before leaving a vehicle overnight. Vehicles left overnight without such arrangements are subject to towing at the owner's expense.
